Those who were born between April 1, 2003 and March 31, 2006.

Infant Course

A: Those who were born between April 1, 2006 and March 31, 2009.

B: Those who were born between April 1, 2009 and March 31, 2012.

C: Those who were born on or after April 1, 2012.

Repertoire for Free Program Course:

Junior Course

All instruments are acceptable.

One piece chosen by the contestant. The length of performance: 5 minutes

Infant Courses

All instruments and vocal music are acceptable.

Courses A & B – One piece chosen by the contestant. The length of performance: 4 minutes.

Course C – One piece or pieces chosen by the contestant. The length of performance: 4 minutes

Requirements and Eligibility for Amateurs Category

Students majoring music at high school, college, university, members of performing groups or music professionals are ineligible. Music students entering with an instrument/voice which is not their major are eligible.

Piano Outstanding Amateurs: Graduates of music school who do not derive their principal source of income through piano performance or instruction are eligible.

Silver Course: Graduates of music school who have not performed or taught primarily for professional pursuits or financial benefit for more than 10 years are eligible.

Repertoire for Amateur Category:

Amateur Category (except for Piano Outstanding Amateur Course)

Regional Round:

One piece chosen by the contestant. Guitar contestants of Virtuoso Course may perform more than one piece.

The length of performance:

Virtuoso Course: 10 minutes
 Excellence Course: 5 minutes
 Superior Course: 5 minutes
 Senior Course: 4 minutes
 Silver Course: 4 minutes
 Duo/Ensemble Course: 5 minutes

Notes: Playing by memory is not required for Junior, Infant, Excellence, Superior, Senior, Silver and Duo/Ensemble Courses in the regional round.

Final Round:

One piece chosen by the contestant. Guitar contestants may perform more than one piece.

The length: Same as the Regional Round

Notes: Playing by memory is not required for Silver and Duo/Ensemble Courses in the final round.

Repertoire for Piano Outstanding Amateur Course

Regional Round:

One piece or pieces chosen by the contestant. The length of performance: 15 minutes.

Final Round:

One piece or pieces chosen by the contestant. The repertoire must be different from the pieces for the regional round. The length of performance: 20-30 minutes.

Eligibility

Section I:

The 1st prize winner of each category

Section II (except Recital Course and Concerto Audition):

The 1st prize winner of each category

Section III (except Youth Repertoire Course):

The best performer recommended by the jury.

Repertoire

Piece(s) of approx. 10 min. chosen by the contestant. For Age-E & J, approx. 5 min.

Note:

The same piece for the finals is acceptable.

The registration form for the Grand Final-Gala Concert will be handed out after the announcement of the finals result.

A shortened piece is acceptable.

◆ Notes

- The piece chosen by the contestant except for the piece for the final round may not be changed after the submission of the application form. The piece for the final round may be changed. Contact the secretariat between August 21 and September 5, 2018.
- The contestant will receive the schedule and other information approximately 10 days before the date of each scheduled regional round and final round.
- If the contestant plays a specific movement(s) or excerpt(s) from a suite or variation, it must be clearly noted on the application form.
- If the contestant plays more than one piece/movement, they must be played in the order written on the application form.
- No repeats are allowed. The piece should be performed without music, **except for the following categories.**
 - Regional Round
 - Section I: Winds
 - Section II: All categories except Recital Course and Concerto Audition
 - Section III: Excellence, Superior, Junior, Senior, Silver, Infant and Duo/Ensemble Course
 - Final Round
 - Section II: All categories except Recital Course
 - Section III: Silver and Duo/Ensemble Courses
- Actual performing time may be shorter than the designated length of performance. When longer, the jury will stop the contestant. The performing time will not affect the result. Duration will be timed from the line marked on the stage.
- Arranged or shortened pieces are not accepted. (Accompaniment may be omitted.)
- Improvisation, prepared piano, etc. are not permissible.
- Except for unaccompanied pieces, contestants should play with a piano accompanist.
- Contestants are required to bring his/her accompanist and perform with an accompaniment. If you need an accompanist, contact and send the score to the regional competition office. The cost is the contestant's responsibility.
- Except for Piano and Harpsichord, contestants must bring their own instrument, pedal extender/platform, footrest, etc.
- The order of performances in the final round shall be decided based on an alphabetical order. Starting letter is decided by the Executive Committee.
- Position of Piano lid and position of the two pianos are controlled by the Executive Committee.
- Recording media, fees and other materials submitted are not returnable.
- Travel, accommodation and other costs must be paid by the contestants.
- The contestants must obtain the necessary visas to visit Japan. If an invitation letter or any documents are required for the visa application, the applicant must request them from the secretariat. Charge for the visa documents is JPY10,000.
- No enquiries about the judging procedures are permitted.
- The 1st to 3rd prize winners in the final round must attend the Award Ceremony. (A proxy is acceptable, except for those who appear in the Grand Final=Gala Concert.)
- Certificates and medals can be sent to those who fail to attend the Awards Ceremony. (Shipping fee will be charged.)
- The contestant and audience are not allowed to take photograph and make audio/video recording during the competition.

- All the performances and its right to broadcasting, recording, filming and photograph in the competition and concert which are related to the competition belong to the OSAKA International Music Promotion Society. The contestant cannot claim the rights for them.
