

Announcement of College of Music, Mahidol University Guidelines on Teaching and Learning and Measures to Prevent the Outbreak of the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) For 2/2021 Semester

Reference is made to the Announcement of the College of Music, on Guidelines on Teaching and Learning and Measures to Prevent the Outbreak of the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) dated November 29, 2021. College of Music is therefore announcing guidelines regarding teaching and learning, operations, and preventive measures for COVID-19 as follows.

YAMP

Teaching, learning, and practicing can be held on campus under the "Bubble and Seal" guidelines with strictly social distancing.

Undergraduate and Graduate Programs

- 1 Teaching and learning
 - 1.1 The following subjects can be held on campus under social distancing measures.
 - 1.1.1 Large ensemble classes shall follow the College's Large Ensemble Project-Based Schedule which shall be announced on the College of Music Mahidol University Academic System (COMMAS).
 - 1.1.2 Small ensemble classes can be held on campus.
 - 1.1.3 Private lessons (one on one performance lessons) can be held on campus.
 - 1.2 Subjects other than those mentioned in 1.1 above will gradually return to campus in the next phases, as will be announced later on COMMAS system. Meanwhile, these subjects will be conducted on the online platform until otherwise announced.
- 2 Use of Buildings and Facilities
 - 2.1 The College's library will be opened weekdays from 8.30am to 5.00pm (except public holiday). Students are also entitled to remotely use electronic music databases, including Alexander Street, JSTOR, Oxford Music Online, Oxford History of Western Music, Naxos Music Library, Naxos Video Library, RILM, and IPA, etc.

The system for use of practice rooms, random ATK testing and entrance to College remains the same as in the last announcement dated November 29, 2021 and related guidelines announced in COMMAS System. This announcement enters into effect from December 20, 2021 until otherwise announced. Please be advised and act accordingly with reference to these guidelines, as well as constantly follow up with further announcements of College and University.
