



Thailand Phil "Wagner, Mozart & Elgar" concerts featured the works of three master composers, under the baton of guest conductor, Jonathan Mann. Open with Wagner's Prelude to his opera Die Meistersinger Von Nürnberg. The dazzling Mozart's Piano Concerto In D Minor performed by Thai piano prodigy San Jittakarn and concluded with the emotionally moving Symphony No.1 by the English composer Edward Elgar. The program kicked off with the Chaotic Noises of Silence Rime, the world premiere of a lively new composition by renowned Thai composer Narong Prangcharoen, followed by Wojciech Kilar's romantic song Mina and Dracula from Bram Stoker's Dracula. Our bass clarinetist Grzegorz Grzeszczyk performed a dynamic and dramatic repertoire of Michele Mangani's Bass Concerto, followed by Aaron Copland's El Salón México captures the energy of Mexican folk music in a piece that pays tribute to the colorful and legendary dance hall of the same name. Finally, enjoy a catchy series of tuneful hits from George Gershwin's "folk opera" Porgy and Bess, presented in a stirring orchestral medley.
